Essay Questions and Answers

Q: What is the Optimist Essay Contest?

A: Every year, Optimist International sponsors an essay contest for the purpose of allowing students to express their perspective on worldly affairs. Local Optimist Clubs host the essay contest to further this initiative.

Q: Who is eligible to participate?

A: Any student under 19 years of age by October 1st, 2020 that has not completed secondary school or its equivalent, including CEGEP students in Québec, Canada. There are no grade-level restrictions or minimum age requirements.

Q: Where should I submit my essay?

A: Submissions for this year's essay will be collected electronically. Electronic versions can be sent to Calvert Optimist Club Essay Contest Organizer, Kimberly Imel, at <u>kni5024@psu.edu</u>. **Accommodations can be made for individuals that need to submit a physical copy.
